## IN 2023 TORINO AIRPORT TRAFFIC FOR THE FIRST TIME OVER 4.5 MILLION PASSENGERS. ALL TRAFFIC RECORDS BROKEN

- Traffic up +8% on 2022, the previous record year
- Passengers up +14.7% on 2019, the pre-pandemic year
- Strong increase for the international segment, at +18.7% over 2022

*Caselle Torinese, 11 January 2024* – Never before has Torino Airport been visited by so many passengers as in 2023. The airport broke all previous traffic records, exceeding 4.5 million passengers for the first time. In 2023, in fact, 4,531,187 passengers were registered, an increase of 337,306 passengers compared to the previous year, amounting to +8% compared to 2022 and +14.7% compared to 2019.

This growth was driven by the strong recovery of the international segment, which recorded a volume of more than 2.33 million passengers in 2023, representing +18.7% compared to 2022 and +15.1% compared to 2019 figures.

Ryanair, which has been based in Turin since November 2021, contributed significantly to this trend with the opening of several new direct international routes during the year. New routes to and from Alicante, Porto, Stockholm and Vilnius were launched in 2023, as well as the new Volotea flight to and from Paris Orly. In addition to the new flights launched in 2023, there was also a recovery of snow traffic from the Northern European, Irish and British markets, with a significant upturn in charter flights by skiers, both in the first quarter of the year and at the start of the season in December.

The top 10 international destinations are London, Paris, Barcelona, Madrid and Munich, followed by Tirana, Frankfurt, Amsterdam, Brussels Charleroi and Valencia. In terms of year-on-year growth, Tirana stands out with +76%, Brussels Charleroi with +67% and Munich with +47%.

At national level, Catania is confirmed at the top of the ranking, followed by Rome, Naples, Palermo, Bari, Lamezia Terme, Brindisi, Cagliari, Olbia and Trapani to complete the top 10.

The month of December 2023, with 356,271 passengers, was recorded as the best December in the history of Torino Airport, after October (395,234 passengers) and November (313,374 passengers) had also broken all previous records. The first half of the year was already record breaking, thanks to the records set in January, April, May and June. Moreover, the week from 2 to 8 January 2023 was the busiest ever, with 103,555 passengers, while Sunday 8 January 2023 was the busiest day ever for Torino Airport, with 19,955 passengers between arrivals and departures.



**Andrea Andorno, CEO of Torino Airport**, commented: "We are very pleased to have achieved this great result, which has led us to exceed 4.5 million passengers in 2023 for the first time in the airport's history. This growth is due to the increase in passenger volumes of passengers from abroad, who have been able to reach and appreciate the many tourist resources of our territory thanks to the numerous direct flights at low prices".
